AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE REPAIR OF THE ROONEY VALLEY LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING FACILITY INCLUDING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE 2014 ANNUAL BUDGET; FURTHER DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Article XII, Section 8 of the City Charter allows City Council to make supplemental appropriations by ordinance during the fiscal year for unanticipated expenditures required for the operation of the City using monies not anticipated in the adopted budget that have become available to the City; and

WHEREAS, the purchasing policies in the City of Lakewood Municipal Code Chapter 3.04.090 require the City Council's approval of any unbudgeted purchase, and any purchase with a change in funding source, that is over \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, the Rooney Valley Law Enforcement Training Facility ("Training Facility") is the primary location for weapons training, familiarization and qualification for Lakewood Police Department personnel and six other law enforcement agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Training Facility sustained erosion and equipment damages due to rain events of 2013; and

WHEREAS, approximately \$65,000 was requested from and approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency in the form of a grant through the State of Colorado to remediate the damage to the Training Facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Lakewood, Colorado, that:

SECTION 1. In accordance with Section 12.8 of the Lakewood Home Rule Charter, \$65,000 is hereby placed in the Grant Fund and appropriated from the Grant Fund for the sole purpose of necessary repairs to the Rooney Valley Law Enforcement Training Facility located at 695 Rooney Road.

SECTION 2. In accordance with Lakewood Municipal Code Chapter 3.04.090, the City Council hereby approves the unbudgeted purchase and purchase with a change in funding source at a cost not to exceed \$65,000 for the repair of the Training Facility.

SECTION 3. Emergency. This ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety due to the fact that delay will increase the potential that additional damage could occur due to snowmelt or rain runoff, which could limit availability of portions of the Training Facility site for law enforcement training and increase costs of restoration. This Ordinance shall therefore take effect upon the Mayor's signature.
