
Roice Horning, Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

- I. Minutes:
  - a. *Motion was made by JoAnn to approve minutes. Motion was seconded and approved by Commission.*
- II. Chair introduced Joni Inman, Director of the Mayor and City Manager's Office. Overall her responsibility is the image of the city. Her team each in turn, introduced what they did for the city:
  - a. Ron oversees the city website. Al is in charge of graphics and the print shop; Kit oversees Channel 8; Stacy is Public Info Officer and she oversees press releases and other print media including Looking at Lakewood
  - b. Channel 8 is a government access channel that is federally regulated for programming.
  - c. Joni's group assists with Annual Report
  - d. Controls what information should or should not be sent out by the City. Is "tone check" on political issues, making sure nothing is objectionable to the image of the City
- III. Discussion on Tabor. How to educate residents about Tabor. City Council has to take a stand on issue before Channel 8 could proceed. Go to Joni or Kit to communicate senior issue via Channel 8. If Council approval is needed they will seek that approval.
  - a. Channel 8 only has two employees. Most programming is done in conjunction with other government stations.
  - b. Field work for programming takes time to accomplish so programming has to be worth the effort.
  - c. Specialty shows usually for division that have budget. Due to constraints on budgets, they usually air shows that are already "done". Trade with other stations.
- IV. Committee Reports
  - a. Communications vote on whether to proceed with the communications/marketing plan. *Motion by Walt to defer until January meeting; Seconded by Ellen and passed by Commission.*
  - b. Roice and Suzy are working with Citizen's for Lakewood's Future for February Forum and LSCAC will have table at event.
  - c. Other committee reports to be held until next month due to time restraints
- V. Discussion by Commission with input from Joni and Kit regarding what steps could be taken to do segment on Tabor.
  - a. *Motion made by Nina to draft letter to City Council on LSCAC request to advise and inform citizens of Lakewood regarding Tabor. Work with the League of Women Voters. Motion was seconded and passed by Commission*
