



WHAT GOES WHERE?

To best accommodate customers, we ask that a load of recyclables not exceed the volume of a typical car or small pickup truck.

Scrap Metal

Place in roll-off marked for scrap metal

98% or more acceptable scrap metal

- aluminum (foil, pie plates, etc.)
- metal lids, bottle caps
- steel cans (food)
- tin cans and pet food cans
- steel, stainless steel
- iron, cast iron
- lead, copper, zinc, brass, alloys
- electrical cords

Metal must be loaded with minimal site attendant assistance (clean, no food or other residue)

(No compressed gas cylinders, microwaves, refrigerators, electronics, ordnances, aerosol cans, drums, paint cans, solar inverter, fluorescent light ballasts or any item/container which contains/contained a household or other chemical (motor oil, Freon, etc.))

Cardboard

Place on tables next to buildings

- flattened corrugated cardboard

(Clean and dry)

Paper

Place in roll-off marked for paper

- newspaper with inserts
- paperboard (cereal boxes, mac and cheese boxes, etc.)
- white, colored paper
- soft-cover books
- magazines, catalogs
- phone books, junk mail
- envelopes with and without film windows
- brochures, pamphlets
- manuals with glue bindings
- file folders with plastic tabs
- paper with staples, paper clips, binder clips

(No shredded paper, wrapping paper, food residue or wet items)

Aluminum Cans

Place in roll-off marked for aluminum beverage cans

- aluminum beverage cans only

(No food residue, cat food cans, aluminum foil, tins or steel cans)

Glass

Place in roll-off marked for glass

- glass beverage bottles and food jars

(No food residue, metal lids, mirrors, windows, plate glass or ceramics)

Plastic (we accept **only** the items listed)

Place in roll-off marked for plastics

- plastic beverage bottles / jugs with caps on
- plastic liquid detergent and shampoo bottles with caps on (no pumps)
- plastic condiment and nut butter jars with caps on
- plastic dairy food tubs with lids on
- beverage cartons; juice boxes
- aseptic and Tetra Pak containers

(No food residue, clamshells, to-go containers, straws, cups, glasses, buckets, pipe, Styrofoam, frozen dinner plates, prescription bottles, trash cans, lawn furniture or any container which previously contained a household or other chemical (cleaners, motor oil, etc.))

NOT RECYCLABLE*

- Styrofoam (Plastic #6)
- plastic bags and wrap
- bags containing recyclables
- trash
- electronics
- compressed gas tanks, propane tanks, aerosol cans
- shredded paper
- **containers which previously contained household or other chemicals (cleaners, motor oil, etc.)**
- anything soiled with food
- food or organic waste
- waxed paper and waxed cardboard
- carpet or cloth
- wet or soiled paper and paper products
- light bulbs
- liquids
- mirrors, window or plate glass, plates and dishes
- chemicals/hazardous waste/radioactive materials

HOW TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT

- Use an Internet-connected computer or smartphone to access Lakewood.org/Recycling and select the Quail St Recycling Center.
- Follow the directions to set up an appointment.
- If you only have a home land-line phone, call (303) 987-7974.

RULES FOR USE OF THE CENTER

- Arrive at beginning of appointment.
- Center accepts recycling volume contained in a typical car or small pickup.
- Sort your recyclables so that recycling is completed within the appointment.
- If you are sick, stay home.
