In July of 1997, Davies Chuck Wagon Diner was placed on the National Register of Historic Places. It remains today a testimony to the pre-fab diners of the early 20th century.



Today, the Stone House is owned by the city of Lakewood and has been repurposed as a wedding and reception hall.



If you haven't seen the display at Addenbrooke Park unveiled in October 2019, local artist Collin Parson does an incredible job of giving us a sense of the original family home using mirrored stainless steel: the original fireplace still looks amazing.



This 1948 Art Moderne building, originally located at 2200 Alameda Avenue, has been a laundry, variety store, and a combination barber shop and beauty salon.



Since 1998, Washington Heights Arts Center has enriched the community by offering a variety of cultural arts educational opportunities for all ages and abilities.





In 1976, the city of Lakewood renovated the Stone House. The Stone House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places



The Addenbrooke house, built in 1954 shows the original fireplace that still stands today.



Owned and operated by Gil and Ethel Gomez in 1963. Look for small decorative tiles, a flat roof, glass-block wrap-around windows, and aluminum door and window trim



In 2019, an infrastructure improvement project took place to ensure the longevity of the historic building.

During the 1990s a municipality bill was proposed that would take down the 36 foot neon cowboy sign. The community rose in protest and helped to save the sign.



Architectural features include a gabled roof and river rock stacked horizontally, taken from Bear Creek. Sandstone frames the window areas on all four sides, providing structural support for the unique wall structure.



While enjoying a walk, a picnic, or watching a soccer match at Addenbrooke Park, look for the restored original windmill that still stands on this once family farm that 3 generations worked for more than 100 years.



The central part of the Caretaker's Cottage was built about 1910 from a "kit" of precut wood and instructions ordered from a catalog.



The Washington Heights School opened in 1898 and expanded twice to accommodate the growing community.



The Davies family opened Davies Chuck Wagon Diner in 1957 on west Colfax. Lyman Davies was a fan of eastern diners and his family wanted to establish one of their own. It is also believed to be the first Colorado franchise for Kentucky Fried Chicken



Built in the early 1860s, the Stone House is located in south Lakewood, on Estes Street along the Bear Creek Greenbelt.



This undated photo shows the original Addenbrooke Windmill in need of some restoration.



After May Bonfils Stanton's Belmar Mansion was built nearby, the Caretaker's Cottage was occupied by the manager of her Belmar Farm.



It was the oldest continuously operating school in Lakewood when it closed in 1968.
